

BHS Acceptable Prerequisites

****Hours in parentheses represent hours needed to apply to the program. All prerequisite coursework to be credited must be at the 101 or higher level with a grade of C or better.**

- **English (6 hrs)** - the discipline that studies the English language
 - ⇒ English, Composition, Linguistics, Journalism, Creative Writing, Literature
- **Math (3 hrs)** - study of the measurement, properties, and relationships of quantities and sets, using numbers and symbols.
 - ⇒ Algebra (typically intermediate), Probability, Statistics, Calculus, Geometry, Trigonometry, Geometry, Pre-Calculus
 - ⇒ >110 level (Depends on school and numbering system.)
- **Natural Sciences (6 hrs)** - deals with the objects, phenomena, or laws of nature and the physical world.
 - ⇒ Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Astronomy, Geology, Earth Science, Ecology, Physical Geography, Anatomy, Comparative Anatomy, General Biology, Advanced Biology, Cell Biology, Microbiology, General Microbiology, Human Biology, Zoology, Physiology, Anatomy and Physiology of speech and hearing, Genetics, Histology, Immunology, Pathology, Molecular Biology, Bacteriology, Neuroscience, Epidemiology, Botany, Marine Biology, Oceanography, Environmental Science, Meteorology, General Physics, Radiation Physics, General Chemistry, Biochemistry, Organic Chemistry, Advanced Chemistry, Natural Science, Biomedical Science, Exercise Science Anatomy, Exercise Science Physiology, Kinesiology, Nutrition, and Pharmacology
 - ⇒ Non-professional program courses
 - ⇒ Includes labs
- **Social Sciences (3 hrs)** - study of human society and of individual relationships in and to society
 - ⇒ History, Anthropology, Economics, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, Business, Archeology, Communications, Ethnology, Geography, Linguistics, Semiotics, Business, Accounting, Management, Marketing, Computer Science, Black Studies, History, Government, International Relations, Sociology, Social Work, Social Science, General Psychology, Abnormal Psychology, Adult Psychology/Aging, Developmental Psychology, Child Development, Child Psychology, Lifespan, Human Growth and Development, Advanced Psychology, Exceptional Child, Law, Criminal Justice, Hospital Administration, Library Science, Medical Terminology, Military Science
- **Humanities (3 hrs)** - studies intended to provide general knowledge and intellectual skills (rather than occupational or professional skills)
 - ⇒ Education, Fine Arts (Art, Music, Dance, etc.), Foreign Language, Literature, Philosophy, Speech, Cultural/Ethnic Studies, Creative Writing, Film Studies, Religion, Architecture, Classics, Communication, Creative Writing, Education, Ethics, Health, Humanities, Journalism, Linguistics, Literature, Publishing, Interpersonal Communication, Theater, Public Health, Interdisciplinary Studies
- **Professional (30 hrs)** – courses contributing to skills and knowledge in a specific healthcare discipline that usually requires licensure and/or certification to permit practice or specialized credentialing.
 - ⇒ From healthcare professional department leading to licensure/certification
- **Electives (25 hrs)** – courses not otherwise categorized
 - ⇒ Non-professional courses
 - ⇒ Any other course work that has not previously used, except for professional courses. The only time extra professional hours can be used is when an applicant has two licensures or degrees. She/he may use the ‘second set of professional courses’ for his/her electives.
