Dear Communication Sciences and Disorders Faculty,

I hope this letter finds you well. As you know, I am a student in the Communication Sciences and Disorders program at the Medical University of South Carolina. There are 55 students currently enrolled in our graduate program. I am also a member of the Charleston Chapter of NSSLHA, the **National Student Speech-Language-Hearing Association**. NSSLHA is a pre-professional membership association for students interested in the study of communication sciences and disorders. Membership provides benefits that help students enhance their academic knowledge, participate in internships and network with others in the field of speech-language pathology and audiology.

The Charleston Chapter of NSSLHA remains actively involved in a number of local philanthropic activities, including the Down Syndrome Association of the Low Country (DSAL). The DSAL is a non-profit organization serving eastern South Carolina that promotes and fosters programs that enable and encourage individuals with Down Syndrome to reach their full potential. There are twenty-four first and second year students who will be attending the convention. Of these, a majority have been selected to present research projects at the convention.
